Trump Admin. Rescinds Transgender Student Guidance: Gavin Grimm of Virginia to Supreme Court in March

The Trump Administration withdrew the Obama Administration's legal guidance protecting transgender students under Title IX. The guidance provided clarity on obligations to students —schools:


- may not prohibit transgender students from using bathrooms that correspond with their gender identity;
- may not exclude transgender students from school activities;
- may not punish students for not conforming to stereotypical notions of masculinity or femininity;
- must give current and former students an opportunity to update their records with accurate name and gender information; and
- may not violate a current or former students's privacy by disclosing their transgender identity to others.

The Administration's letter stated "...withdrawal of these guidance documents does not leave students without protections... All schools must ensure that all students, including LGBT students, are able to learn and thrive in a safe environment."

Gavin Grimm, the transgender teen from Virginia whose school bathroom access case will be heard by the Supreme Court, said, "Thinking about transgender students everywhere, hearing that your presidential administration has gone out of its way just to further discriminate against you... is very upsetting..."

- The letter did not and could not repeal Title IX.
- The letter did not and could not require schools to discriminate or stop complying with the guidance. Local school districts and states can still follow it, and do more to support trans students.

We urge our members to take the opportunity to share your views.



Richmond Mayor Levar Stoney (JMU alum, class of 2004) supported LGBTQ issues on the campaign trail, and now he hopes to see Richmond designated as a top tourist destination in the Nat West British LGBT awards. The annual British LGBT awards ceremony supports causes in the UK and around the world, honoring people, organizations and places in almost 90 categories with about 100,000 votes submitted every year.

"In 2014 we did something no other city ever did, we came out of the closet," said Stoney. "OutRVA represents more than just a marketing campaign, it's a welcoming way of life." Stoney was invited to be a part of the video in connection with the city's LGBTQ tourism campaign, OutRVA. Created by VCU students in 2014, the Richmond Region Tourism has used the campaign to help show RVA is a great place to be no matter who you love.
